The AmeriCorps Seniors who were able to attend the event were given a delicious meal provided by Kathy Greenland, owner of Greenland's Lodge. AmeriCorps Seniors were also given gifts of appreciation which included a red insulated bag, a word search book, a multi-use screwdriver, 2 Forget-Me-Not seed packets, 2 cork coasters, and 2 magnetic notepads.

At the event, four Legacy Awards were distributed to four AmeriCorps Seniors. Dave Fryer, an AmeriCorps Senior who served at Huntingdon Meals on Wheels and James E. Van Zandt VA Medical Center, received a Legacy Award for the longest serving AmeriCorps Senior in RSVP of Huntingdon County by serving 9 years and 11 months. Judy Kimberlin, an AmeriCorps Senior serving at United Way of the Southern Alleghenies and Center for Community Action, was rewarded a Legacy Award for being the longest serving AmeriCorps Senior in RSVP of Blair County by serving 9 years and 3 months. Margaret (Peggy) Loibl, an AmeriCorps Senior at CONTACT Altoona, received a Legacy Award for serving the most hours, which totaled to 1,066 since October 2023, in RSVP of Blair County. A Legacy Award was presented to Reeder Swartz, an AmeriCorps Senior serving at James E. Van Zandt VA Medical Center and Huntingdon County Military Share Food Program, for serving the most hours, 378 since October 2023, in RSVP of Huntingdon County.
